

COURSE SAFETY

We politely request that all members, their guests & visitors note the below points when playing the course:

1st Hole

- When playing from the back tees (Green & Silver) as your 1st or 10th hole, please ensure you stand to the right of the tee (clubhouse side) whilst waiting to play. If you stand to the left of the tee you can adversely affect those playing the 9th hole.
- Please be aware of any group playing the 9th, when teeing from the 1st/10th hole.*

2nd Hole

- The pond in front of the Gold tee & behind the Blue tee is very deep. Please **do not** attempt to recover golf balls.

3rd Hole

- From the 3rd tee be mindful of any drive struck to the right, as the 4th green sits behind the pine trees on the right.

4th & 5th Holes

- When playing your approach shot to the 4th green please be aware of golfers playing from the 5th tee, that is positioned to the rear of the 4th green.

6th Hole

- Along the right hand side of the 6th hole is the Mildenhall Road. Please report to clubhouse staff any stray shots that leave the course boundary.

7th Hole

- Please be aware of vehicles entering and exiting the course.
- Please ensure you wait for the green to be clear prior to attempting to drive the hole.
- Please report to clubhouse staff any stray drives that are struck out of bounds into the car park.

8th Hole

- Please report to the clubhouse staff any approach shot that is struck over the left-hand boundary of the course into the gardens of houses on The Links.

9th Hole

- Please do not play to the 9th green unless you are sure the driveway is clear.
- Please be aware of the 4th tee to the left and the 1st tee to the right of the 9th green and the clubhouse lawn/terrace.

COURSE ETIQUETTE

3 Tee Start

- If the flow of play allows, players can start their rounds from the 1st, 4th, or 7th tees. However please ensure you respect the speed of play and ensure groups already on the course are not delayed.
- If playing before 08:30am please tee off from the first tee only.

*1st & 9th Tee

- It is customary once you have

finished putting on the 9th green, to wave the following group to play up to the green, prior to teeing off the 1st tee as your 10th hole.

- When playing from the 1st tee if the group playing the 9th hole are over the road you should wait for them to play through. However if they have not reached the road, you are free to commence play.

LOCAL RULES

Out of Bounds (see Rule 18.2)

Out of Bounds is defined as:

- Beyond any fence, hedge or railing bounding the course.
- Beyond the white posts and dedicated signs bounding the course.
- In or beyond any ditch bounding the course.

Penalty Areas (see Rule 17)

Where present, red or yellow stakes show where a penalty area is but have no other meaning. The edge of the penalty area is defined by its natural boundaries.

Roads and Paths

The metalled entrance road is an immovable obstruction from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1. All other tracks and paths are integral objects and the ball must be played as it lies.

Ground Under Repair

Ground under repair is defined by any area encircled by a white line from which play is prohibited. The player must take relief under Rule 16.1.

Practice Ground

Please do not use a club that carries more than 200 yards whilst on the practice range.

Fixed Sprinkler Heads Close to Putting Greens

Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect.

Protection of Young Trees

The young trees identified by stakes or guards are no play zones from which the player must take relief under Rule 16.1f.

Aeration Holes

If a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole, the player may take relief under Rule 16.1b or 16.1d.

Animal Dung

At the player's option, animal dung may be treated either as a loose impediment (see Rule 15.1) or Ground under repair (see Rule 16.1).

Penalty for Breach of a Local Rule:

General Penalty

Match play - Loss of hole;
Stroke play - Two strokes.

Putting Green

Always be aware of players tee shots into the 9th green, when using the putting green.
